His next vessel, and the first he owned, was schooner Sarah M. Jacobs, which he commanded in 1878. His stock this year was \$19,900.

Her successor was schooner Edward E. Wheeler, and for four summers he pursued the mackerel without a letup, in this craft. The first summer she was new, for about six months in the mackerel fishery, he stocked \$20,000, the next year, in 1882, \$39,700, the crew's share being \$1005 each of 18 men. Other record-break-




