BAD WASHOUT ON C. P. R.

St. John, N. B., Jan. 7.—There is a bad snow storm over the C. P. R. between Montreal and Boston, trains being held at Fredericton Junction, and will probably not reach here today. Some severe miles of track are under water.

The storm has done much minor damage in this city. Owing to the flooding of a creek, a section of the city near Haymarket Square is flooded, and the lower portions of houses invaded. Street car traffic at that point is discontinued.

S. A. TO INSURE EMIGRANTS

ng of	Provide Against Sickness or Unem
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London, Jan. 7.—The Salvation Army is arranging to insure its emigrants to Canada against the risk of sickness, accident, loss of luggage or unemployment. Regarding the last, it is stated that even in the worst period of industrial depression, last winter, the Salvation Army headquarters at Toronto had always more vacancies on farms than men. Salvation Army emigration starts on March 17.

Decision of Justice Surprises Counsel

Toronto, Jan. 7.—Mr. A. F. Lobb, K.C. counsel for the Hydro-Electric Commission, was surprised when he heard of Justice Latchford's decision allowing the Beardmore suit to go on without the addition of the commission as a party.

"Of course it does not affect the commission," said Mr. Lobb. "We are not a party to the suit, and will only be affected if the city is released from carrying out its contract with them."

"I should think the city would have

no hesitation in appealing such a decision on a point that has been well established."
