## VESPER SERVICE

His Lordship Bishop Fallon Assisted in the Cathedral Last Night.

FATHER NOLAN'S SERMON

An Eloquent and Scholarly Address on the Roman Catholic Church by a Lowell Priest.

Pontifical vespers were sung last evening at St. Peter's Cathedral. The congregation was as large, if not larger. than the one attending the consecration. There was not a vacant seat in the spacious cathedral. Bishop Fallon was in attendance and took part in the service.

The sermon was preached by Rev. Father Nolan, O. M. I., Lowell, Mass., and was a very eloquent and scholarly address. Prior to the sermon he made a happy allusion to the new bishop, and added his compliment to the ability of the head of the diocese. Loss of the Oblates.

Father Nolan declared that the Oblates were losing one of their most valued priests. This caused them sorrow, for the loss was heavy. However, they rejoiced that he had been raised to the dignity of the episcopacy, and he felt certain that he would bring to bear his great ability in defence of

"I congratulate the priests of this diocese," said Father Nolan. "I congratulate the people of this parish, in that they have a bishop who will raise his voice for his people, who will use his great talents in defence of that faith so dear to all Catholics. Oblates are sad to lose a father, a brother and a friend, but we rejoice in the honor done him, and trust that his labors among you may be abundantly successful under Ged." Sermon on the Church.

The sermon was on the church, and dealt with its history from its inception to the present day. He pointed out that although time had left its imprint on all things human, it had failed to leave a mark on the brow of the church, and she stood today, not in the decrepitude of old age, nor in the de-cay of strength, but in full vigor and The Christ came and found strength. the world steeped in idolatry. He spoke of righteousness and judgment to come. The people and the rulers conspired against him. They asked him to deny his divinity, but he refused. He was crucified. On his resurrection he commissioned his disciples to go throughout the world and preach the gospel. Then came the persecutions of

the early days.




