"A great many vessels will be operated on the route this season," said Mr. Greer today, "and when the boats get hungry there will be something doing."

Mr. Greer did not intend to intimate that the C. P. R. would inaugurate a cut in existing tariffs, but he expects a drop in rates before the end of the season, and

After reckoning the number of vessels which would be operated this summer between Vancouver and points on the northern provincial coast as far up as Port Simpson and the Naas, Mr. Greer said there would be at least eight vessels regularly in the trade, and at least two other vessels may be counted on to make northbound calls at Port Essington and Port Simpson. The two vessels will be the C. P. R. Skagway liners.

According to present knowledge there will be operated this season on this route the steamers Princess Beatrice and Tees of the C. P. R. fleet; the Camosun, Capilano and Coquitlam of the Union Steamship Company's fleet; the Venture of the Boscowitz Steamship Company; the Henriette, belonging to Mackenzie Bros., and the steamer now in course of construction at North Vancouver for Captain Otto Buckholitz and associates. Eight steamers in all will be regularly engaged in the trade, not counting the little steamer Nell, which will in all likelihood be in commission again this year.

The Princess Beatrice, Camosun, Henriette and Venture, are all large carriers, and the other vessels have accommodation for hundreds of tons of cargo among them. According to Mr. Greer's expectations, competition will be so keen among the various steamers that a cut will be forced from the weaker ones before the fall.


