VALUE OF PROPERTY EMIGRANTS TO U. S. IN DRY U. S.

Enormous Increase Since Prohibition Began to Get Firm Foothold

The value of all property in the United States in 1923 amounted to \$230,808,882,000, compared with \$186,229,664,000 in 1912, according to late census reports, giving an increase in the ten years of \$44,579,218,000, or 24.5 per cent. In 1900 the total value was reported at \$88,817,300,000. This gives an increase in the 23 years of \$142,000,000,000. In other words, in the 23 years, the wealth of the country almost quadrupled. The per capita value increased from \$1,960 in 1912 to \$2,918, or 48.4, in 1923.

In this connection, it is interesting to note that the Southern states, which always have been a bit backward, had in 1923 \$71,354,707,000, which is a billion dollars more than the total wealth reported by the rest of the country outside the South in 1900. The South gained faster in proportion in the ten years from 1912 to 1922 than the rest of the country, for its gain was 78.4 per cent, while the rest of the country gained 24.5 per cent. The increase in the South was \$19,900,000,000. The increase in the rest of the country was \$22,454,707,000. It should be remembered that the years 1900 to 1920, and especially from 1912 to 1922, were years of great advance of prohibition legislation, and as far as the South is concerned, it was the section outside of Maine and Kansas, which went dry first. No one doubts that the material property of America is due entirely to prohibition, but it is significant that the increase in wealth has been more rapid, and pronounced since prohibition began to get a substantial foothold in this country.

ANTIQUE TREASURE
THIEVES UNCAUGHT
Records of Detective Fall in Efforts to Trace Robbers Who Stole Valuables From Lady Ludlow's Mansion in Fredericton.
London, June 18.—A three-column advertisement listing in detail the articles taken from Lady Ludlow's mansion in Piccadilly last Thursday and offering \$4,000 reward for the recovery of the property, is published in this morning's newspapers. Scores of detectives thus far have failed in their efforts to trace the robbers, and their prospects of success are not regarded as promising. It is suggested the robbery was committed by people desirous of securing antique treasures, who could not dispose of the property to receivers of stolen goods because any of the articles would be immediately recognized. Thus, says the newspaper, the robbers are presumably burdened with property worth 100,000 pounds on which they cannot raise a shilling.
