It is proved to be the truth that Mr. Gladstone's scheme of Irish home rule is a great day for Ireland.

It is possible that England and Scotland may have something to say about it.

The latest we know of Mr. Gladstone's scheme is supplied by the Globe's London correspondent.

It means in brief this—big powers to the Irish legislature, with practical control of the purse.

The Imperial Parliament. A few are to be admitted, on occasions, but they will have no weight.

Parliament's power of making and unmaking English ministers will be gone.

But the powers of the Irish legislature are to be a great way.

An Irish ministry will control the magistracy and police, and undertake the enforcement of the law, and have supreme authority over all Irish affairs except the military forces of the state.

The control of the treasury. The victory will be appointed by the crown, and will probably be non-political, as the victor of India. He will not have a seat in the Imperial cabinet, nor go in as a member of the House of Commons.

The existing constabulary as an armed, drilled military force will be under the direct orders of the victor as the Imperial troops garrisoned in Ireland.

Provision will be made for the gradual conversion of the constabulary into a civilian or municipal force.

It is scarcely worth while to go further into what we know.

Mr. Gladstone's scheme has been approved of by the Irish members in the House of Commons (a few exceptions).

It is disapproved of by whom? Of course by English Tories. But that does not close the chapter.

English Radicals have declared against it in advance, and the English Liberals will count for something.

Mr. Gladstone seems to solve right off a tremendous problem.

A prevailing suspicion is that he has lost his head, and has consulted Mr. Parnell too much.

However, the Liberals, Independents are well known. Can it be that England and Scotland have anything to say about all this business? Or is Ireland the supreme authority? Just wait and see.

Cheaper Railway Rates.

Notwithstanding the great decline in price in other directions, railway fares continue almost as they were twenty years ago.

Concessions to certain privileged classes, to excursionists, etc., have been made, but the ordinary rate per mile is lower than the ordinary rate per mile.

Railway travel is too dear at present. The retail section of the Board of Trade sought to arrange and solve committees to work to strengthen with the railways.

It is a pity that the Board of Trade failed to do this. Newspaper and congressional bluster will not settle the matter; honest negotiation will. In the meantime, we intend to keep the New England fishermen out of our waters.

A Buffalo murderer has been sentenced to death.
