FRAUDS IN CHEESE EXPORTS

HOW THE ENGLISH BUYER WAS DE LUDED IN HIS PURCHASES

United States Cheese Allowed to be Forwarded From Canada Labeled Only as "American" Cheese, a Term Easily Liable to Misinterpretation in the English Market.
