 Signs of a Hard Winter.

That the coming winter is going to be the  
 hardest one for the past twenty years there  
 is an abundance of signs to show, and among  
 them it may be mentioned that—  
 The corn husks are a foot and a half thick  
 and all the stalks lean to the west.  
 The geese, ducks and chickens are grow-  
 ing a coat of fur under their feathers, and  
 are rubbing borax on their feet to harden  
 them up.  
 All the one-eyed owls are leaving the  
 country a month earlier than usual, and the  
 bob-tailed squirrels are laying in sweet  
 potatoes, as well as nuts, for winter  
 provisions. The farmer who takes the trouble  
 to investigate has found that all the toad-  
 stools on the old logs have wrinkles in them.  
 The last time that this happened he had  
 winter weather that froze the handles off  
 plows.  
 Rabbits are sitting around with a humped-  
 up look on them, and field mice have wrinkles  
 in their tails. If this means anything,  
 it means twenty degrees below zero from  
 November through to May—Tyrone  
 Herald.

**Farm Lease Dispute.**  
 The following questions and answers ap-  
 peared in the "Legal Column" of the Mail  
 and Empire last Saturday:—  
 B B, Forest.—Q.—A rented a farm to B  
 for one year from the 10th of March, 1903.  
 The lease states that either of them can  
 terminate it by giving six months' notice.  
 The lease also says that the crops grown on  
 the farm must be fed on the  
 farm. B bought a farm a few miles  
 away and has removed the grain and hay to  
 his own farm. Can he be compelled to pay  
 damages?  
 (2) B took a quantity of rails from the  
 fences on A's farm and is using them on his  
 own farm, can he be prosecuted for so  
 doing?  
 Ans.—Whatever B has done in violation  
 of the terms of the lease he will be liable  
 for. A can sue for damages for breach of  
 the covenants in the lease. The clause  
 which provides for putting an end to the  
 lease by a six months' notice, means a six  
 months' notice given so as to terminate with  
 same year of tenancy.  
 (2) The removal of rails by B to his own  
 farm is theft. A tenant has no right to re-  
 move the fences in any case, but when he  
 takes the rails and converts them to his  
 own use it is clearly a case of stealing.

UMBRELLAS should always be set to dry  
 open, with handle on floor. If allowed to  
 dry shut up the moisture stands so long at  
 the top it rots the silk and rusts the wires.  
 Do not keep an umbrella in its case or roll  
 ed when in the house, as the silk, thus  
 tightly creased soon cut into holes. In  
 rolling up an umbrella for its case grasp the  
 ends of the rods tightly with one hand near  
 the handle, and roll from the opposite end  
 with the other hand; unless the frame is  
 well held in place, it is twisted and loosened  
 in the rolling process.

THERE has been considerable discussion  
 lately about the rights of companies, run-  
 ning wires on the streets, to cut shade trees.  
 Act 243, R. S. O. provides that a person  
 owning land adjacent to any highway,  
 street, lane, alley, place or square in this  
 Province may plant trees on the portion  
 contiguous to his land, and every tree so  
 planted shall be deemed to be the property  
 of the owner of the land adjacent to such  
 highway, street, lane, alley, place or square  
 and nearest to such tree. It is also pro-  
 vided that any person injuring such trees,  
 without having obtained permission by  
 special resolution of the Council, is liable to  
 a fine of \$25 or thirty days in goal. The  
 person laying the complaint is entitled to  
 one half the fine imposed. The residents of  
 Watford who have trees adjacent to their  
 property have the same rights of ownership  
 as if the trees were within their property.
