

Church School for Girls.

The initiatory step in the establishment of this School was taken by the Alumni of King's College, Windsor, on the 25th June, 1890. (1) The project was brought under the notice of the Synod of the Diocese of Nova Scotia in the address of the Bishop on June 27th.

On the 1st July the matter came before the Synod by resolution. After discussion it was unanimously decided by both orders, that a "Church School for Girls, at Windsor, Nova Scotia," should be forthwith established on the basis of a Joint-Stock Company, and on the following conditions:—

I. The financial affairs of the Association shall be managed by a Board of seven Directors, to be elected by the Shareholders in such way as they may determine.

II. The Discipline and Instruction, as well as the appointment of the Teaching Staff, shall be controlled by a Board of nine Trustees, three to be appointed by the Shareholders, one by the Synod of Nova Scotia, one by the Synod of Fredericton, two by the Governors of King's College out of their own body, the Bishop of Nova Scotia, and the Bishop of Fredericton. The Bishop of Nova Scotia to be Chairman *ex officio*. (2)

On the 2nd July, the Synod of the Diocese of New Brunswick con-
