### Tobacco Poisoning in Infants:

An American contemporary calls attention to the likelihood of the infants of the poor being poisoned by having to inhale an atmosphere saturated with tobacco smoke. With the limited accommodation at their disposal, it is quite conceivable that men after coming home from work, and in the early morning, poison the air of the room in which the family live. A correspondent goes so far as to say, indeed, that he has met with many such cases, the correctness of his diagnosis being proved by the recovery of the infants when the cause was suppressed. Infants a few days old are naturally very sensitive to the effects of a pollution which would inconvenience even grown up persons, and although there is a tendency for tolerance to be established, it can only be at the expense of health. The symptoms are, loss of appetite, sunken eyes, listless ways aud restless nights, with nausea and vomiting. It would perhaps be as well for medical men practicing in the poorer districts to bear this possibility in mind -Medical Press and Circular.
