PRAYERS.

Two Petitions were laid on the Table.

The Clerk of the House laid upon the Table the Second Report of the Clerk of Petitions, stating that he had examined the following petition presented on the 13th instant and finds that all the requirements of Standing Order 68 have been complied with in this case, namely:—

Of Mary Kaydouh Massabky, of Outremont, Quebec, at present residing in Brooklyn, New York, United States of America, praying for the passing of an Act to declare her marriage with Antoine George Massabky, of Outremont, Quebec, to be dissolved, and that she be divorced from him.—*Mr. Hyndman.*

Mr. Dunning, a Member of the King's Privy Council, laid before the House, —Copy of Order in Council, P.C. 374, dated February 13, 1936, passed under the provisions of the Relief Act, 1935: authorizing a loan to the province of British Columbia of the sum of \$4,300,000 to enable the said province to meet certain debenture issues falling due 15th February, 1936, payable in Canada or New York.

Mr. Power, a Member of the King's Privy Council, laid before the House, —Copy of Order in Council, P.C. 91, dated January 16, 1936: amending certain regulations adopted by the Department of Pensions and National Health, under the provisions of Order in Council, P.C. 848, dated May 29, 1925, and P.C. 1842, dated October 18, 1928.

Mr. Lapointe (Quebec East), a Member of the King's Privy Council, laid before the House, —Copy of Reports made under the provisions of Sections 87 and 88 of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police Act, as enacted by Chapter 40 of the 1934 Statutes—Part IV, Pensions for Widows and Orphans of Constables.
