No person shall sell or distribute or otherwise supply to the public any detergent or cleaning agent containing a phosphate compound unless the concentration of phosphate compound in the detergent or cleaning agent is not greater than the concentration of phosphate compound in the detergent or cleaning agent specified in the schedule to this Act.

3. No person shall, in advertising or otherwise representing a detergent or cleaning agent, make any false or misleading representation that may reasonably be expected to deceive or mislead.

4. Any person who fails to comply with the provisions of sections 2 or 3 is guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine of not more than two thousand dollars or to imprisonment for not more than six months or to both such fine and imprisonment.
