Manufacturers have se-cured protection for themselves, not by individual, but united effort, and by a plan and policy that seems to benefit not only one particular line of manu-facture, but the great majority of the industries of this country. As veget-able and email fruit growers you ought to get the support of every locality that is represented here. Perhaps not more than ten or fifteen counties pro-duce vegetables and small fruits to any considerable extent, and if you get the support of these for a protective mea-sure, it might not succeed, and we
