There is a lot of vigorous criticism of the action of the Toronto postal deparament in the manner in which the distribution of the morning mail is handled in the Todmorden district. The letter carrier from Station G on his arrival in the morning on the Broadview car, instead of starting at once on the distribution in Todmorden, goes instead by way of Sarah-street and Dartford-road, westerly to the Rosedale saw mills, crossing the C.P.R. tracks, and later going northerly and ascending to the highlands again by way of what is known as "Bag-Shop Hill, opposite the Todmorden Hotel. In this long detour the best part of an hour is lost to the two thousand residents of Todmorden, greatly delaying the delivery of the mail over a wide area. It is charged that the difficulty and annoyance could be obvisted by allowing the letter carrier from Station F, in Rosedale, to make the delivery to the sawmill people.

There will in all probability be a fairly large representation from the Todmorden district to the East Vork Conservative meeting in Society Hall, East Toronto, to-morrow (Thursday).
