# ANGUS POINTER WINS IN STRAIGHT HEATS

Free-For-All at Providence — Margaret O, Lotta and Ethan Roberts Win.

PROVIDENCE, R.I., Aug. 27. — Park Brew Day at Narragansett Park brought out a large crowd in expectation of interesting racing. It was thought by the knowing ones that more than one record

would be lowered, especially so in the Park Brew Stake, but nothing of the sort happened. The most that was required of Angus Pointer, the winner of the event, was to equal the record made by Gallagher in 1904 of 2.04. The fastest field ever witnessed in any such event started in this race—Angus Pointer, 2.03; Audubon Boy, 1.994; Gratt, 2.024; Baron Swatan, 2.034, were all picked to do the honors, but Angus Pointer was the only one of the lot to show his mettle, capturing first money in straight races. The gelding was the favorite in this race.

would have been had pool-selling been allowed. He showed great form, and would easily have lowered the track record for the event, as well as his own. He was pushed at Readville last week had he been pushed. But at no time was he in any danger.

Both heats produced sensational driving in which Davis outclassed Geers and drew away from the bunch, just nosing out Tempus Fugit, which had been the lead.

The third race, 3:08 trotting, required a close heat, Lotta belonging to Crabtree stable and Beatrice Bellini driving first and second money as was expected. The last race of the day, the 2:13 pace, had but four starters, and went easily to Ethan Roberts.

As an extra attraction, Immaculate tried hard to beat the 2:15 trotting record, but the best she could do was 2:19.
