REV. MADRILL DISCIPLINED.

Committee Recommends That His Name Be Struck Off the Roll

Of the Congressional Union—Report of the Special Committee—Will Be Heard in His Defence This Morning—Rev. J. W. Peckley of London Elected Chairman.

The Congressional Union opened their second day of business yesterday, with the election of a chairman for 1893. Two candidates presented themselves, Rev. J. W. Peckley, of London, and Rev. H. Hyde, of the east end.

Mr. Peckley was born in Durham, England, 42 years ago. He was educated at McGill College and the Theological College in Montreal, and after three years in the ministry, he came to Canada in 1882.

The next affair to sit the pulse of the delegates was reading the report of the committee on the standing of Rev. Mr. Madrill, which was presented by the Rev. J. W. Peckley.

Sir Mackenzie Would Like to See How the Franchise Bill Favours.

Ottawa, June 9. (Special.)—Senator Drummond, when the grant to Montreal harbor was being discussed in committee of the Senate yesterday, moved to strike out the clause granting \$700,000 for the dry dock.

When the plebiscite bill came up for a third reading Sir Mackenzie asked that the bill be allowed to stand until the Commons dealt with the franchise bill. The passage of the plebiscite bill, in its present shape, would depend upon the action of the Lower House on the franchise bill.

INSURGENTS FIGHT ONLY.

Spaniards Trying to Prevent the Landing of Supplies.

Santiago de Cuba the Objective Point—American Vessels Have Cut All Cables—Ensign Palmer Commended for Bravery—Lieut. Hobson Still a Prisoner of War.
