The Marconi Wireless Telegraph Co. of America has been organized with \$4,000,000 capital stock to control the Marconi system of wireless telegraphy and all instruments and materials relating thereto in the United States of America, Cuba, Puerto Rico, the Hawaiian Islands, the Philippine Islands and all ships under the American flag.

Wesley Dunn bought 75 sheep at \$4.25 per cwt., 35 calves, at \$5 each, and 30 spring lambs, at \$3.50 each, at \$4.50 per cwt. W. B. Leveck bought 25 sheep at \$4.50 per cwt., 20 lambs, at \$4 per cwt., and 10 calves, at \$4.50 each.

McClendon bought 16 butchers, 1200 lbs. each, at \$5.50 per cwt. Zeigman & Sons bought 30 steers, 250 lbs. each, at \$2.25 per cwt.

The quality of the cattle, with the exception of a very few, was not nearly as high as on Tuesday last. Too many half-bred rough cutters are being offered, for which drovers were asking as high prices as were paid for cattle that were better finished, and sold here on Tuesday.

Dealers were not prepared to pay these high prices for unfinished cattle, which caused the market to be somewhat drab. But it must be remembered that the same high prices as have at any time been paid for such cattle, and that the best of the sheep and calves were sold at \$2.50 per cwt. and \$4.50 per cwt. respectively.

Butchers' cattle of choice quality sold at high prices. Whaley & McDonald sold 100 butchers' 100 lbs., ranging in weight from 750 to 1100 lbs. each, at \$5.50 to \$5.75 per cwt., with one lot of 23 of this number at \$5.25 per cwt.

Dealers and stockers of good quality are in as good demand as ever, but "off color" and ill-bred stuff was sold at lower figures, as will be seen by sales given below. Few mixed cows were offered and prices were about the same.

Good sheep are wanted and prices are at quotations given. Few good grain fed yearling lambs are being offered and prices are firm at such as \$6.00 per cwt. and something very choice would be worth a little more.

Altho the deliveries of hogs were liberal, prices were firm at Tuesday's quotations. William Harris, Jr., stated that the hogs he sold were for still higher prices in the near future.

Export Cattle—Good loads of heavy shipper are worth \$6.50 to \$7.50; medium exporters \$5.40 to \$5.75 per cwt. Export Hogs—Choice heavy export hogs sold at \$4.50 per cwt. Export Cows—Light export cows sold at \$4.50 per cwt.
