

negotiations for resumption of trade between Great Britain and Soviet Russia are not preventing British manufacturerers from taking advantage of the Russian markets. At least two large Yorkshire woolen mills are working at high pressure to turn out orders for hundreds of thousands of yards of textiles for Russian account, it became known here today.

As Yorkshire men proverbially are hard-headed businessmen the guarantee for payment they obtained are interesting commercial circles where it is believed the financial end of the deals must have been arranged through neutral, probably Scandinavian banks, Through these banks, it is said, it would be easy to give drafts for soviet gold which is known to have been deposited in several European cities some time ago.
