Old Budweiser, 16 Yrs. Beaten a Nose in Last

Toronto Cup Feature Today's Holiday Card

FAVORITES AGAIN LAND FOUR RACES OVER HEAVY TRACK AT WOODBINE PARK

The President First and Second in Breeders' Stake—Three Beaten Choices Run Outside the Money—Lady Moll the Long Shot to land.

Marvellous weather favored the Ontario Jockey Club for the third day's races at Woodbine Park. It was sunny and warm and the attendance was well up to the standard. The track was slow, but drying out fast and should be in fine shape for the Toronto Cup today. The President won his daily race with Mandarins, the Breeders' Stake, and the Pink Budweiser almost won. The old nag has been only unplaced once in his 16 starts since his retirement, four times, six seconds and five thirds.

H. S. Bedwell won the steeplechase with Early Light, and the Waterloo Plate over a distance of ground with Balfour. The riding of Jockey Anderson was worthy of note. He showed skill in bringing Commensalia from last position to win the opening event from a fine field. Astrologer ran a good race his first time out this season. Tito drove past Lochiel, Lady Spendthrift and Tankard for third.

Lady Moll the Best. Lady Moll was best of the ordinary field of two-year-olds. She beat Bright and Early in the run home. Freshet, the pacemaker, just staying third in front of Kentucky Boy, that was made favorite for some reason or other. Idiotia also had a good following.

Kame, from the successful Montreal stable, was backed slightly to beat Mandarins and Gals Water in the Breeders' Stake and some more for the place. The gelding looked like something for three-quarters, but the pace was too hot. Mandarins took the lead rounding the

lower turn and the pacemaker stopped up in the stretch. Old Pop was always many lengths in the rear.

Gentleman had to do her best to beat Typograph and Shirazel, but the gelding was off first and stayed there through, the placed filly coming like a wild horse up to the stretch to make a head finish. Shirazel beat Gordon a neck for the show.

Early Light took command in the steeplechase when the colts, who collected that ran the last mile rideless, interfered with Idiotia Michael, the second round. Cynouros was third. They were all strong out.

You Remember Balfour. Balfour, that has been seen before at the Woodbine, was the best in the sixth. Balfour surprised everybody by shooting out in front to lead for three-quarters and then hung on. Balfour took command in the stretch and won easily. Miss Waters, rank outsider, came up for the place. Counterpart, favorite, and Duke of Dunbar were disappointed. Duke of Dunbar was criticized for dropping a race here to Catwren, 20 to 1, a year ago.

Old Budweiser, 16 years, made the last race the closest finish of the day, and would have won but for the clever riding performance of Anderson on Ask Ma. The veteran gelding made the pace thru out and was driving home like a three-year-old when Ask Ma took the short course and just showed her nose on the rail to the judges in front of Budweiser. Obolus came along for the show. Broomeades, favorite, chucked it round in the turn.

Favorites again had a margin on the day. Commensalia, Mandarins, Gentleman and Early Light represented the money. H. S. Bedwell claimed Ask Ma out of the last race, and took the mare at the selling price.

The card today looks the best of the week and includes the Toronto Cup, \$5000 added, the Coronation Stakes, \$2500 added, and other features.
