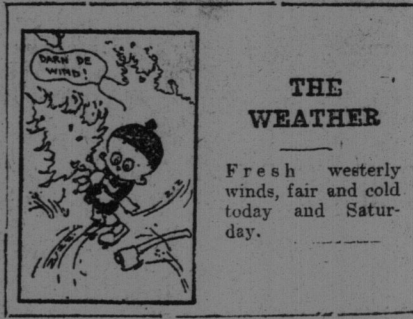

CAST UP BY SEA; HE HAD HARD FIGHT

Nantasket Closing Scene of Tragic Experience of Fishermen in Recent Gale

HUNGRY EIGHT DAYS No Food and at Mercy Waves for Hours in Effort to Reach Boston From Plymouth—Too Weak to Eat When Found

Nantasket, Dec. 31—Without food for eight days and for 12 hours at the mercy of the waves off Nantasket in a disabled motor fishing boat, John Brown of Boston was cast ashore at Waveland and crawled on his hands and knees to a primitive half-way house put up by the Hull life savers' patrol.

Too Weak to Eat He was taken to the life saving station and Captain Storrow and his men worked for hours until he was able to eat a little food. Although almost starved, he became so weak that he could eat at first with difficulty, but last night he had nearly recovered from his frightful experience.

Gasoline All Gone Almost before he was out of the harbor the engine began to go wrong, but he thought he would be able to get safely through. The continued jouncing of the boat as the heavy seas that were kicked up by the wind after nightfall caused the water to splash over the boat and he was chilled to the bone.

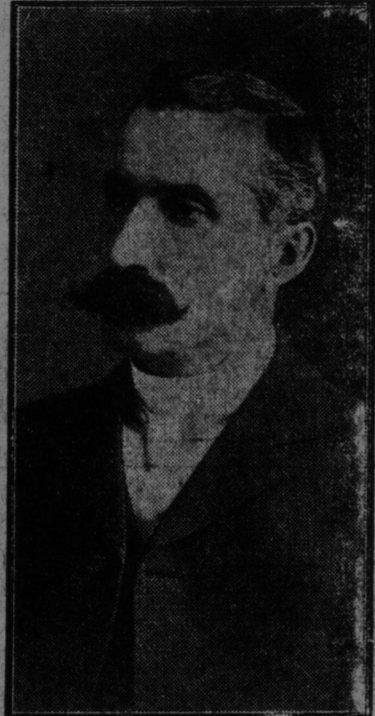

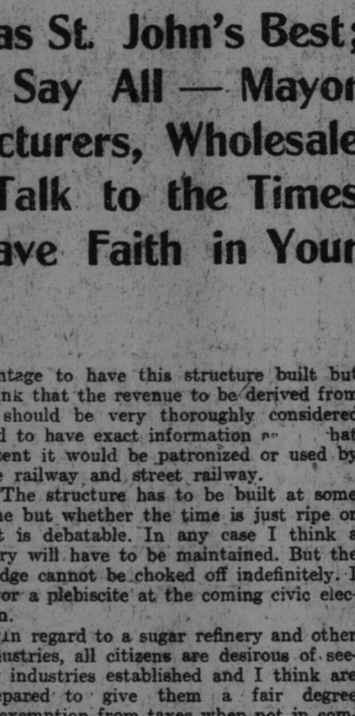
