The English are fighting mad in the presence of the contradictions of democracy and the insolence of privilege. And they stand by the logic of their own constitution.

The House of Commons met yesterday and told the Lords that they had committed an act of anarchy in rejecting the budget. The House of Commons has been in the light and vigor of this idea. And it lodged the power of the purse in the House of Representatives, as the English had before.

Agitate, take note that the English budget refuses to tax the life-necessaries of the poor. The English budget, upon those who are able to bear them. The contested budget proposes an increase in the running of fifteen per cent. in the case of the greatest fortunes. It takes twenty per cent. of the unearned increment of land.

It adds a new tax to an income tax that has long been an established institution in Great Britain.

The like of these measures we in America have reached toward. But we have hardly dared frame them in terms of statute law.

Great Britain may be a decadent nation. But at least it has the political stamina to do so.
