## KINGSCLEAR TO HAVE REV. THOS. PARKER PASTOR

Mission Requests It Be Placed in Self-Supporting List

THE Anglican Mission of Kingsclear, which has been in receipt of a yearly grant of \$700, asked the board of missions of the Fredericton diocese to be granted permission to become a self-supporting parish and the board in session last evening acceded to the request which is a most unusual one and was received with much gratification. Rev. Thomas Parker, who has been at Norton, will be rector of Kingsclear and will enter upon his duties in his new charge shortly. It was also announced at the meeting that the deficit in payments by missions to the home mission fund had been reduced by nearly \$2,000 and now stood at about \$7,000. His Lordship Bishop Richardson, who presided, referred to statements given at the meeting of the general synod which had shown the diocese of Fredericton stood third in the average amount contributed by each family for all missionary purposes.

### REGRET ABSENCE

Much regret was expressed at the absence of the secretary, Ven. Archdeacon G. S. Newham, of St. Stephen, who was prevented by the serious illness of Mrs. Newham from attending the meeting.

The board of education heard reports of the various parishes dealing principally with financial matters. Rev. D. W. Blackall, of Oak Bay, who is now on leave of absence in England, wrote concerning his illness and the sympathy of the meeting was extended.

### MISSIONS VACANT

Missions reported vacant included Norton, Sackville, Grand Falls, Richmond, Bright, Richibucto and Hillsboro.

With a view to economy a redistribution of work was arranged to combine the missions of Peterborough and the mission of Greenwich. Rev. J. Robinson Belyea, rector of Peterborough, is to have charge of the combined missions.

## WILL CALL NEW STREET FALLS VIEW AVENUE

Protest Against Cutting of Timber on Watersheds Received by Council

THE COMMON COUNCIL yesterday decided to name the street to be taken over from Murray and Gregory, running from Douglas Avenue to the Murray and Gregory mill, Falls View Avenue. A communication from the West Side Progressive Association, protesting against the cutting of timber on the watersheds was referred to Commissioner Wigmore for a report and it was decided to have the city solicitor enter an appearance for the city in the case of Fred R. Taylor, K. C., vs The City of Saint John.

The report of the committee of the whole, recommending that retaining walls be built at 464 Main street and 268 Duke street, and that the C. N. R. be notified that the city was willing to rectify an error in the plans recently filed for the expropriation of Southwark street, was adopted. A copy of a writ served on the mayor on October 15, in the case of F. R. Taylor vs the City of Saint John was read and referred to the city solicitor to enter an appearance and put in a defence, if necessary. This is an appeal from the valuation set on Dr. Taylor's property, Germain street, by the assessors.

The New Brunswick Electric Power Commission wrote calling attention to the non-payment of their account of \$20,122.15, with interest, "somewhat long overdue" and asked that a check for the amount be forwarded. This was referred to the Mayor.
