BRIBERY CHARGED

Goderich, Ont., June 20—Police Magistrate Kelly this afternoon remanded for trial until Wednesday next at 10 a. m. Dr. A. H. Macklin, Conservative candidate in the approaching provincial election, and Rev. Joseph Elliot, in connection with the bribery charge preferred against them by John B. Hunter, organist at Knox church here.

Hunter was not present, Crown Attorney Seager explaining that he was at Hamilton to fulfil an engagement at a church there on Sunday. Dr. Macklin admits that he gave Hunter \$10, merely, however, he said, as a loan in connection with Hunter's trip to Hamilton.

Million Dollar Hotel Ottawa, June 21—The Canada Gazette announces the granting of letters patent to the "Hotel Company of St. John, Limited." The authorized capital stock is \$1,000,000 and head office at St. John (N. B.). The company is empowered to do a general hotel and licensed victuaries business.

WOMEN CRIMINALS IN GERMANY BEHEADED

Berlin, June 20—In marked contrast with the tolerant spirit of the English authorities toward the militant suffragettes and the agitation in the United States against capital punishment of women criminals, Germany evidenced her sentimentality toward the weaker sex when two women were beheaded by headmen with blocks and axes, making a total of four women to suffer a similar fate within a few weeks. The death sentences were executed according to the medieval method, which Germany, of all civilized nations, retains.

Margareta Mendel, forty-one years old, was beheaded in Esburg prison, with her accomplice, Joseph Wirt, a laborer. The two had poisoned the woman's husband so as to get him out of the way.

Frau Mendel, terror-stricken, collapsed utterly as she started towards the block. She acted as one totally paralyzed, and it finally became necessary to place her on a stretcher, carry her to the block, and lay her on it. Wirt went to his death quietly.

At about the same time, Frau M. Hass was beheaded in the prison at Graudenz. She also had poisoned her husband. Details of this execution were given out.

In the case of the Kaiser refused to commute the sentence of the condemned persons or to take into consideration the fact that two of the criminals were women.
