RECORDS KEEPER BUSY IN LONDON
London, April 19.—(By mail.)—Dr. A. G. Doughty, Archivist and Keeper of the Records at Ottawa, is still in London. He spends laborious but congenial days at the Public Record Office in Chancery Lane, turning over and copying heavy documents.

Dr. Doughty is unapproached in his knowledge of what is a "genuine antique" in regard to the early days of Canada. On this visit he has discovered some "new" maps of Canada, which were drawn about 1776. Early governors of what used to be known as "the Canadas" frequently brought back to England private papers which are now of immense interest in reconstructing the early history of the Dominion.

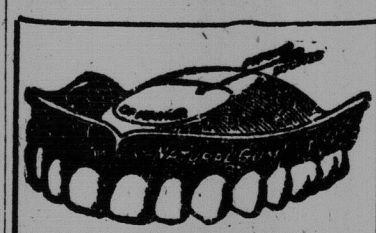

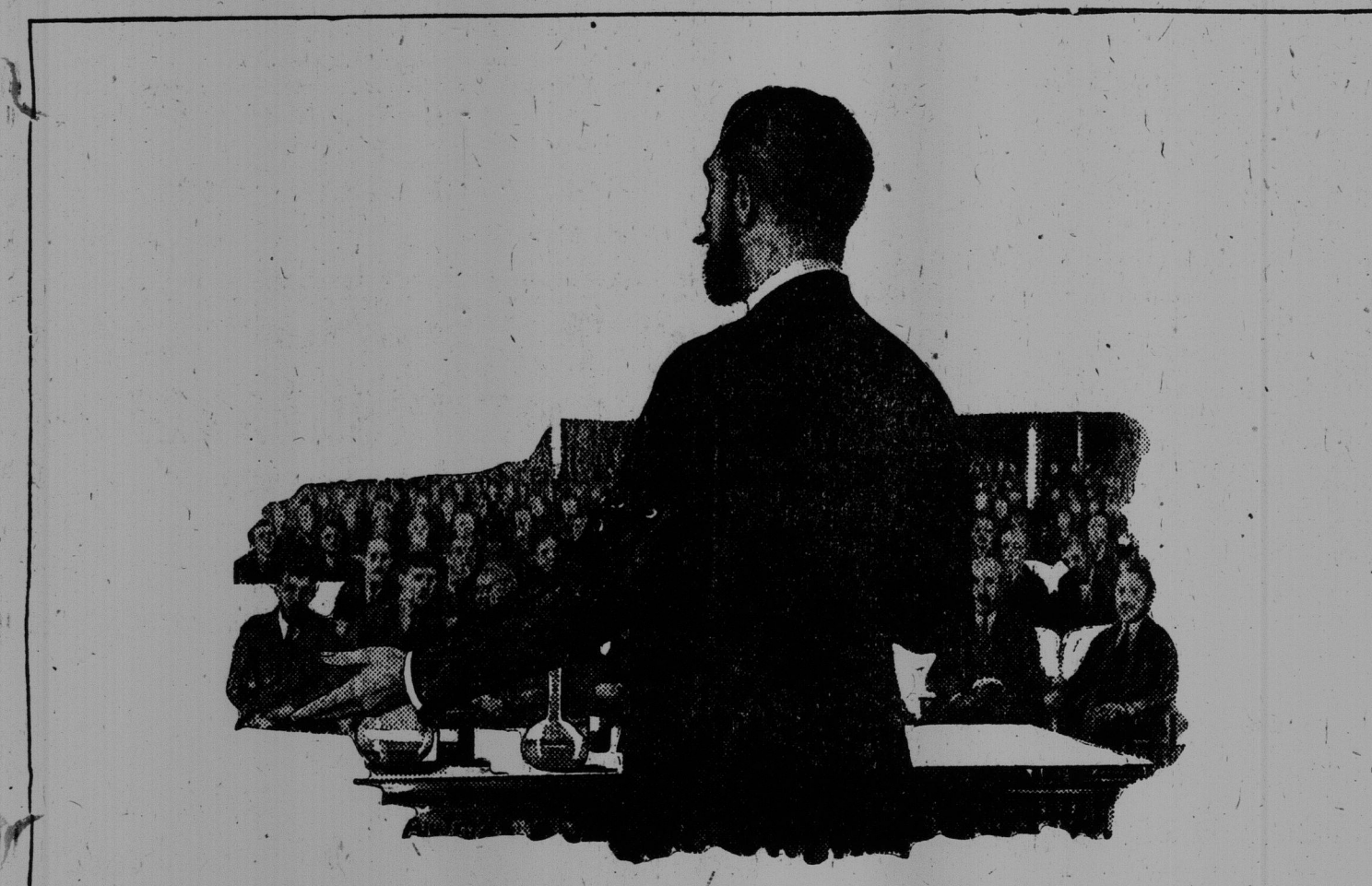

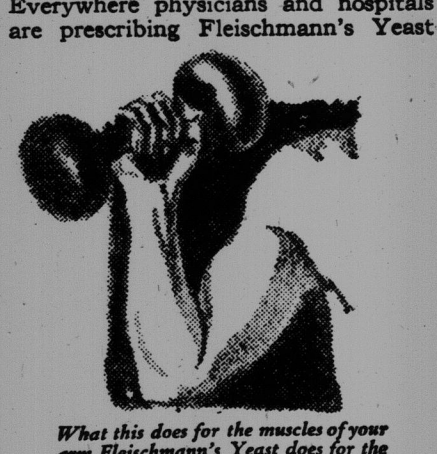
