17th. Voted that Elder J. BURTON preach the Introductory Sermon next year; in case of failure, Elder C. TUPPER; also, that Elder J. MUNRO prepare the Circular, and Elder D. NUTTER the Corresponding Letter.

18th. Read a letter, from the Church at Miramichi which came to hand to day, requesting the Ordination of brethren T. ROBERTSON and C. MILLAR. After agreeing to attend to this request to-morrow morning, at 5 o'clock, we adjourned till that time.
