BY-LAWS. At a meeting of the Council of the Municipality of the County of Northumberland, held at the Council Chamber, Newcastle, on Tuesday, the eighteenth day of January, A. D. 1881.

BY-LAW. Relating to Dogs. Be it ordained by the Municipal Council of the County of Northumberland: 1. A tax of \$1.00 shall be imposed on the owner, keeper, or harbinger of each and every dog.

BY-LAW. Relating to the going at large of Cattle. Be it ordained by the Municipal Council of the County of Northumberland: 1. That no cattle be allowed to run or go at large on the shore, between the mouth of Fairley's Mill Stream, and the lower line of the farm of John Gillespie.
