EAST BRANCH CUT IS SMALLER THAN LAST YEAR

BANGOR, March 21—According to an estimate as near accurate as it is possible to make at this time, there will be about 40,000,000 feet of new logs to come down the East Branch this season. This cut is about 20,000,000 feet short of that of last season. The cut is apportioned as follows: Katalidin Pulp and Paper Co., 4,500,000 feet; Eagle Lake Co., 15,000,000 feet; Cornelius Murphy, Thistle Brook, 1,000,000 feet; Finch and Gardner, 1,500,000 feet; Katalidin Pulp and Paper Co., Wassaquoit, 1,000,000 feet; Oscar Thomas, Mud Brook, 1,000,000 feet; George Walker and Sons, 1,500,000 feet; J. L. Lumber Co., Grindstone, 2,500,000 feet. Total, 39,500,000 feet.
