## PRICES MUST DROP BEFORE WAGE CUT

J. T. Foster Also Claims That Work is Scarcer and More Men Are Unemployed.

Montreal, Oct. 22.—"The labor employment situation in Montreal now is not in good condition," said J. T. Foster, president of the Trades and Labor Council, this morning. He has been away from Montreal for about five weeks attending conventions, and found the state of employment there was also poor, if anything, worse than here.

"The Angus shales of the C. P. R. last week," said Foster, "employed 350 men, and also gave their hands a long week-end holiday for Thanksgiving Day. The United Shoe people laid off their night shift, and the Vickers plant are not employing anything like capacity, and while I have not exact figures, I find there is a general slackening of work."

"But this does not apply to the building trades," he added, "in which work is good."

"But I would emphasize that prices have to come down before wages. We know that prices have not all been cut to high wages, and men who have been getting the high prices will have to drop some of their profits before they cut wages."

## SHARP ADVANCES IN CHICAGO GRAIN

Chicago, Oct. 22.—Active buying for export together with optimistic advances in regard to the prospective settlement of the British coal strike led to sharp advances today in the wheat market. Prices closed strong, 4 to 6 cents net higher. Corn gained 1 to 1½, and oats ½ to ¾. In provisions the outcome varied from 40 cents decline to 25 cents advance.

ABANDONED ON FIRE  
Halifax, Oct. 22.—A cable from London states that on Oct. 11 the 38-ton schooner Ella C. Hollett, owned at St. John's, Nfld., but built at Shelburne, was passed at sea abandoned and on fire in latitude 44 north, longitude 17 west. No word as to the fate of the crew has been received here.

The Ella C. Hollett is practically new and well known provincially. She made two trips to Halifax this year from Newfoundland, arriving last on Saturday, May 15, from Burin, with 2,500 quintals of dried fish, which she discharged at Smith's. Subsequently she loaded machinery for St. Pierre and laid for a time at both Campbell's

and Farguhar's wharves. She cleared for St. Pierre Jan. 31.

Montreal, Oct. 22.—The White Star Dominion liner Canada will dock here tomorrow morning. The C. P. O. S. Coraican is expected here Monday, as also the Anchor-Donaldson liner Saturnia. The C. P. O. S. Har Metagama leaves here for Liverpool tomorrow morning with 385 cabin and 423 third-class passengers.

BURNED ON OPERATING TABLE  
Liverpool, Oct. 22.—After an operation for cancer, Ellen McLoughlin, a middle-aged woman, died in the Royal Infirmary here.

At the inquest it was stated that during the operation the electrically warmed table got hot. The woman was severely burned, and despite prompt treatment died.

The jury found that death was due to the condition of the kidneys following cancer, adding that it was accelerated by burns, which might have been avoided.
