British Exports Scheme Outlined

Trade Commissioner Explains
Provisions of New Plan to
Assist Empire Trading.

The extended facilities of the new scheme of British exports are detailed at length in particulars just received by Captain Evan J. Edwards, senior British Trade Commissioner, Montreal, and it is stated that the new scheme applies to all parts of the British Empire, including protectorates and mandated territories, but excepting British India, Ceylon, or British possessions in the Orient. The scheme is for the benefit of produce or manufacturers of the United Kingdom, and will not be extended to allens or allen-controlled companies or firms, and the voting power and control of companies must be vested in the hands of British subjects.

This scheme does apply to the imports of Canada and Newfoundland from the United Kingdom, stated Capt, Edwards, when interviewed on the subject, adding that he had had many-sequities on this quastion.
