

To all this the true communisti

spirit is altogether opposed, and the work is concluded with a comparative and radi-cal estimate of the possibilities of the principle. As a matter of economica science, Mr. Nordhoff considers the comnunistic principle an excellent one, and despite such mistakes as many of them make, he thinks the social state is more comfortable than with the average class outside.
