At the dedication of all these Churches, Dr. Freshman was present, preaching three times on the Sabbath, as well as assisting us on other occasions, and at different times, by his valuable counsel and advice.

These new appointments have this year contributed over \$100 towards the Missionary Fund, besides providing for the board and horse-keep of my two colleagues without expense.

This is a promising Mission. "Two or three Churches more could with advantage be erected immediately at our other appointments. There is plenty of room for additional laborers. The people are kind and liberal according to their ability; those whom we have reached hunger and thirst for the gospel. O, that the set time would come, when God shall make the people free! We are earnestly striving, praying, and working for that end. The past year has been one of unceasing labor, not merely physical labor, but the cares and anxiety connected with the sole responsibility of such a large field have been more than I thought would be able to be borne by one so young as I am, but "we can do all things through Him that strengthened us," and our Master has promised, "Lo, I am with you always, even unto the end."
