

and in addition 10% of the gross rentals and concessions derived by the Town of Carlyle in connection with the said lease. The Indians expressed a further wish that the leased land be known under the name of "The White Bear Lake Resort".

With respect to the additional lands which the Town made application to lease, the voting members present agreed unanimously to accept the offer of \$400.00 rental per annum until 1938, and for the balance of the term \$400.00 per annum and 10% of the gross rentals and concessions from the lands within the lease.

I am forwarding herewith surrenders in connection with both parcels of land, together with the sworn declaration of myself and the Chief and Headmen of the Band, as well as a list of the total voting strength of the Band and the result of the vote, and trust you will find all in order.

I think it would be advisable to have the agreement prepared and completed with the Town as soon as possible as it would give the cottagers who have investments at the Resort a feeling of security. They have been rather uneasy regarding the whole matter for some time.

I may inform you in conclusion that the day following our meeting a large body of the Indians headed by their Chief and Councillors came to the office to see me and requested me to express their gratitude to the Department for getting this question settled so satisfactorily for them. They appeared to be very happy about the whole matter. This has been a vexed question with them for many years, but it is to be hoped that from now on a much better feeling will exist.
