Interesting Newspaper of 1865
 An interesting newspaper is in the possession of Mr. George Martin, the former manager at the local House of Industry. It is a copy of the New York Herald of April 15, 1865.

The paper is therefore 54 years old. The feature in it that makes it not only interesting but valuable is the news about the assassination of President Lincoln and the latter despatches about his death. The style of headlines, however, is quite different than that of the journals of today. While there are big headlines, they are limited to one column, wider than that of today. Big heavy black type and borders were used to impress upon the readers the sadness of the biggest news of the issue. The issue also contains the latest news about the progress of the civil war, giving the accounts by both sides. In the centre of the upper part of the front page is a big cut of President Lincoln.

The paper is a four page one. It

does not require much perusal to see that the people in those days believed in advertising. Big display advertisements fill two pages. Mr. Martin in the days of 1865 was living at Hespeler and he has had this paper which was sent to him from the other side of the border ever since, although he had almost forgotten that he has it.

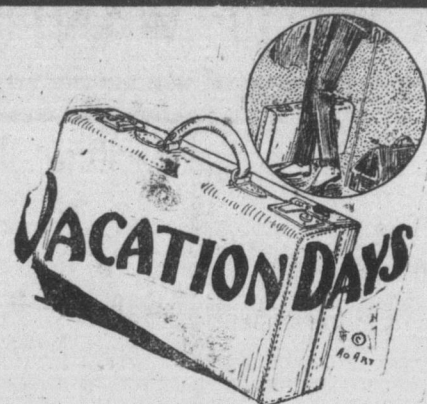

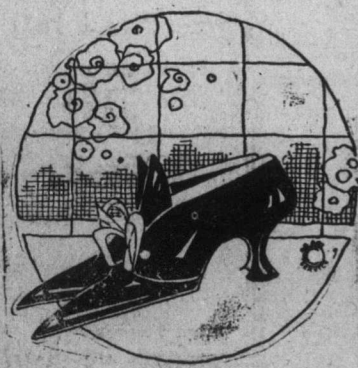
