Officer shall thereupon grant their Warrant for the lading or unlading of such Goods.

XXXII. Provided always, and be it enacted, That where there is If no Officer no Collector or Comptroller or Officer of Customs at the Port or of Customs Place of Shipment of such Goods, then the principal Civil Officer in the Port of the Service of Her Majesty at such Place, or his sufficient Represchipment, sentative, shall be deemed and taken to be the proper Officer for the Certificate Performance of all such Duties with respect to such Goods as are by whom to hereby required to be performed by the Collector or other Officer be granted. or Officers of Customs.

XXXIII. And be it enacted, That if the Importer of any Goods Entry Inshall make and subscribe a Declaration before the Collector or Comp. wards by troller or other proper Officer that he cannot for Want of full Left. troller or other proper Officer that he cannot, for Want of full Information, make perfect Entry thereof, it shall be lawful for the Collector and Comptroller or other proper Officer to receive an Entry by Bill of Sight for the Packages or Parcels of such Goods by the best Description which can be given, and to grant a Warrant thereupon, in order that the same may be landed and secured to the Satisfaction of the Officer of the Customs, and at the Expence of the Importer, and may be seen and examined by such Importer in the Presence of the proper Officers; and within Three Days after the Within Goods shall have been so landed the Importer shall make a perfect Three Days Entry thereof, and pay down all Duties due thereon, and in default of Goods of such Entry such Goods shall be taken to the Queen's Warehouse; perfect Entry and if the Importer shall not, within One Month after such landing, to be made make perfect Entry of such Goods, and pay the Duties due thereon, and Duties together with Charges of Removal and Warehouse Rent, such Goods shall be sold for the Payment thereof, and the Overplus (if any) shall be paid to the Proprietor of the Goods.

XXXIV. And be it enacted, That in all Cases where the Duties Goods subimposed by this Act upon the Importation of Articles into Her ject to ad Majesty's Possessions in America or the Mauritius are charged not Duty. according to the Weight, Tale, Gauge, or Measure, but according to Value to be the Value thereof, such Value shall be ascertained by the Declaration declared on of the Importer of such Articles, or his known Agent, in manner and Entry. form following; (that is to say,)
