103.—The Clerk is to make arrangements for Laws exexchanging the Laws of Canada, for those of the ^{changed}. Imperial Parliament and of the Colonial Legislatures:

104.—The Clerk is to furnish the Librarian with suf-Reports, ficient copies of the Journals and of all Reports from &c., for General Heads of Public Departments, or concerning any Exchange. Fublic Institution, for general exchange.

105.—The Journals of the Senate, according to Journals Parliamentary usage, may be searched by the House searched. of Commons, as the Journals of that House, may be searched by the Senate.

XIII.-LIBRARY.

105.—A proper Catalogue of the Books belonging Catalogue to the Library is to be kept by the Librarian, who is of Books responsible for their safe custody. He is required to ^{kept.} lay on the table of the Senate, at the opening of each Session, a report on the state of the Library.

107.—No person shall be entitled to resort to the Admit-Library during a Session of Parliament, except the tance to Library. Governor General, the Members of the Privy Council, The Senators and the Members of the House of Commons, also the Officers of both Houses, and such other persons as may receive a written order of admission from The Speaker of either House. Senators may personally introduce Strangers to the Library during the day time, but not after the hour of seven o'clock, P. M.
