

An Act to incorporate the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer.

WHEREAS the persons hereinafter named have, by their petition, prayed that it be enacted as hereinafter set forth, and it is expedient to grant the prayer of the said petition: Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

Preamble.

1. The Reverend Fathers Alphonse Lemieux, Edward Strubbe, Louis Savard, Edmond Flynn and Gustave Vermeiren, members of the Religious Community of the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer, together with such persons as become members of the congregation, are hereby incorporated under the name of "The Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer," hereinafter called "the Congregation."

Incorporation.

Corporate name.

2. No legal title deed in which the said community is erroneously designated as "The Redemptorist Fathers" shall be set aside by reason of such error, if the said community was intended to be designated by such deed.

Redemptorist Fathers.

3. Only persons belonging to the religious community known in the Roman Catholic Church under the name of "The Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer" may be members of the Congregation.

Who may be members.

3. The persons named in section 1 of this Act shall be the first directors of the Congregation.

First directors.

2. The board of directors of the Congregation shall consist of five members, of whom three shall be a quorum.

Number of directors.

3. The board may make by-laws, rules and regulations for the administration of the property, management and internal government of the Congregation, the election, number and power of its officers, the admission and retirement of its members, the number and place of meeting of the directors, and generally all by-laws consistent with the laws of Canada.

Power to make by-laws, etc.

4. The Superior of the said community in the city of Montreal shall be, ex officio, the president of the board of directors.

President of board.

4. The Congregation shall have its corporate seat in the city of Montreal, but it may establish houses in different parts of Canada for the purposes for which the Congregation is incorporated.
