Revision court decisions mailed

The final decisions from a list of 5,280 made by Mississauga's two courts of revisions were made last week and mailed to taxpayers who launched appeals on their assesments.

Hearings wound up last Tuesday following 10 1/2 weeks of public testimony and deliberation by the six members of the two courts.

The court officers m e t Wednesday and Thursday to make decisions on the last few hearings and decisions were in the mail by the weekend.

The sittings began Jan. 16 in the wake of mounting criticism and alarm over the county council's reassessment program in Mississauga late l a s t year.

year. Many pomeowners and property owners found their assessments hiked up to as much as 150 percent by the new program. Taxes

of many rose accordingly. It was earlier estimated by town council that as many as 5,000 other property owners would have launched appeals had they realized what they were in for.

Last week it was reckoned that about 270 property owners were unsatisfied with the courts of revision
