The Sup^t Genl of Indian affairs has
the honor to submit for the consideration of
His Excellency the Gov^t Genl, the accompanying surrender
of the Indian Reserves on the Whitefish River on Lake
Huron

The terms on which this cession has been made
are as follows

- 1st That it should be surveyed and sold for
their benefit, & the proceeds of the sale
emitted in the usual manner
- 2nd That the fishing below the Falls be retained
for their use
- 3rd That should any number of the Band
surrendering desire to purchase eighty acres
he may do so at the usual price -

The tract has a very irregular frontage on the
Lake, & extends inland 7 miles - Part of it has
been leased to the Hon W Cayley

The Sup^t Genl recommends that the
Surrender be accepted -
