

Lecture VIII

When a man is taken into Parliament he vacates his seat in H of C. Certain offices prevent their holders from being eligible for election. Certain pol. offices may be held by members of the Senate.

It has been said that Govt is not bound by advice of ministers when he is dealing with Imp. matters. Under the Crown we hold a double position (1) as Imperial Officer (2) as Gov. Genl.

It is difficult to conceive of any class of functions he may have to discharge with the Govt of Canada in which he might claim the right to act independent of his ministers. If he is given an Imperial mission e.g. to communicate news of his ministry to members at Washington, but this is quite exceptional.

The measure of legislation may be divided into 2 classes (1) Money bills (2) Other bills

Money bills must be ^{recommended} ~~introduced~~ by a despatch from Govt. and proposed to govt by a minister of the Crown, but by other matters members may introduce bills.
