There is also attached a ring binder containing the earlier correspondence with all the Provinces and a summary of the principal points involved.

Mr. McLarty has left with me, to be shown to the Prime Minister, a copy, which is attached, of a letter which Mr. Mackinnon received today from the Deputy Attorney-General of Alberta, which indicates that the attitude there is not so promising as he had gathered from the earlier telephone message. I have, at the Prime Minister's direction, spoken to Mr. MacKinnon about the advisability of sending a personal and private letter to Mr. Aberhart in advance of any formal approach. Mr. MacKinnon's view is that this would be very helpful. Such a letter could be sent by air mail, and delay avoided in that way.
