also the difficulty of negotiating a settlement through procedures that will provide equitable and adequate recognition of the interests of all active allied belligerents. In the waging of war, however, Canada contributed her resources of men and material without reserve. No question of partial participation arose. It should be possible, therefore, to emsure for Canada an opportunity to contribute to the negotiation of peace on the same basis of honourable partnership that characterised her contribution to the war.

Canada was proud to share the fortunes of war with her Allies. She expects to share with them also the task of making a just and lasting peace.
