BY THE JUDGE ADVOCATE:

Q-256 When did you make up your mind to put Adams under arrest?

A-256 Immediately I found the money, sir.

2-257 Did you give him any warning after you had made up your

mind to put him under arrest?

A-257 No, sir.

Q-258 You know that I mean by warning?

A-258 Caution?

Q-259 Yes?

A-259 Yes, sir.

Q-260 Did you give him any warning at all?

A-260 No, sir.

Q-261 Who else was present when you searched his kit?

A-261 Trooper O'Neill, the regimental provost, was there at the

time.

Q-262 . And did you awaken Adams by yourself?

A-262 No, Lance-corporal Willett of Headquarters Squadron did.

Q-263 And this was at 0730 hours?

A-263 No, sir, between 0800 and 0830 hours.

Q-264 Adams was still in bed?

A-264 Yes, sir.

2-265 Did he have the appearance of a man with a hangover?

A-265 Yes, sir, he did.

Q-266 Was he then still in an intoxicated condition?

A-266 No, sir, he wasn't.

BY THE COURT:

Q-267 Did Adams say anything to you after the money had been

found and before he was placed under close arrest?

A-267 No, sir, he did not.

Q-268 Did you ask Adams any questions after you found the money

and before Adams was placed under close arrest?

A-268 Yes, sir. I asked him how the money had got in his kit

bag of who put it there, or words to that effect.
