W. 20 chains, thence N. 20 chains, thence NW 20 chains
thence N 20 chains, thence NW 40 chains, to the E bank
of Lillooet river. This land used to be the timber
lease but has been all logged out."

(d.) "On W side of lillooet river. Commencing at
the N.E. corner of block 932, thence W 40 chains,
thence N. 160 chains, thence E 40 chains, more or less
to the W. bank of lillooet river."

(e.) "Commencing at the N.W. corner of block 925;
thence S 40 chains, thence W 160 chains, thence
N. 40 chains, thence W. 20 chains, thence NW 20 chain
more or less to the S. bank of the Spring West
boundary of Ind. Res. No. ?."

"The lands applied for above contain some patches
suitable for farming & pasture here & there although poor.
They are the best near by available & the inds will be
satisfied with them as they are badly in need of addi-
tional farming & pasture lands. There are no whites on
any of the lands applied for."

Irrigation water.

The inds ask that there be ample water secured for
all their reservations. Res. No 8 has a sufficiency
of water but Res. No 6 has none & some other res-
erves are short. They say there are no whites
using the water from the creeks, so there should
be no difficulty in procuring full water rights for
the inds.

Fishing

It seems the Douglas band has not been
granted any exclusive fishing rights on the
Lillooet river like the Skookumchuk & Samah-
quam bands. The band wants to have exclus-
ive rights of fishing opposite on the edge for
shores of all reserves extending out stream some
