of little things which comes after the glory of battle will be lived in the same spirit; Rabbi Ben Ezra's consciousness of infinite good.

"Follow to the end, Benjamin. Then remember the sturdiest challenge to death ever uttered:

"I was ever a fighter, so one fight more, The best and the last."

"Follow to the end, children of Columbian. You shall not fail of a glorious haven."

And the mountains and the sky and the trees joined in the welcome:

"Everything's worth while, our hero,
The shapes of things, their colors, lights, shades—
The beauty and the wonder and the power,
And God made it all."
