Fifteen cases of Bibles were shipped last year to the far north, to be distributed among the Takudh Indians who live on the borders of the Arctic circle. For over thirty years Arch-deacon McDonald has been working towards this end, having first to reduce the wild sounds to make them intelligible in writing, and then to translate the Word of God into that language. In 1862, as an ordained missionary, Mr. McDonald was sent to the Yukon where he remained until 1870, since which time he has been laboring near the junction of the Peel and McKenzie Rivers. There are now nearly 500 Christian Indians under his charge, so God has blessed and honored his self-sacrificing labors. Some of us remember the visit of this earnest worker for God to Lindsay, and I trust bear him up in our prayers.
