REMEDY FOR LICE ON CATTLE

1. Give sure remedy for large blue lice on cattle.

2. What will kill the common red lice, will not kill the blue ones. W. G.

Ans.—1. Insect powder (pyrethrum), sifted into the hair of cattle, will kill blue lice as dead as the Dodo. We have seen the worst case of blue lice cleaned out with one application, and in one night. For either red or blue lice, a mixture of dry cement and pyrethrum, sifted or rubbed into the hair, is a sure cure. It is good practice to clip the hair short on back and neck before treating with the mixture, when less of it will answer the purpose.

STEAM HEATING HOUSE.

I think of putting in a system of steam piping to steam the feed for milk cows and hogs. Could I put in a system to heat the house also by the hot steam, and, if so, what sized piping would I need to convey the steam from the boiler to the radiators. My boiler is one that furnishes steam for a seventeen-horse-power engine. I use it for cutting straw and chopping. I have abundance of cheap wood. Do you think it would be as cheap a system as I could instal to heat the house, as I would have a fire in the boiler every day for the heating of the feed? The boiler would be 100 feet from the house.

Ans.—You could certainly arrange a steam-heating system for your house, using the boiler mentioned as a source of steam, but just what size of piping you would need to convey the steam from the boiler to the house is impossible to say, unless one knew all the circumstances. You had better see your local plumber about the size of pipe. In heating systems of this kind, the pipe from the boiler to the house must be very well insulated, or there is a great loss, and the heat proportionately expensive. It is just doubtful whether such a system would be economical on a small scale. You had better consult your local plumber, and arrive at the cost and economy of the system before going ahead with it.
