

IRELAND.

DECEMBER, April 20, 1848.

The manufacture of pipes still proceeds as vigorously as can be desired by the most sanguine supporters of the physical force part of the community. The deposits are still making a run upon the Savings Bank, and a gold and silver Bank of Ireland is being started. The bank of the week before last, and the county banks in the same ratio. Great excitement is also made in all parties on account of the government "gaffing bill" as it is called, and as the State trials approach, all look forward to the result with eagerness and anxiety. The news of the proceedings of the Americans in regard to Ireland, has been hailed with loud acclamations, and it may not be long till the offer made by the Americans be required to be recalled.

The State trials will not take place till after the sittings, which commence on the 12th proximo, but on Saturday last the traversers, Messrs. O'Brien, Mitchell, and Meagher, took their departure for the committee rooms of the Confederation, and proceeded on foot to the bar court. The traversers stood in the same manner as they did in their previous trials, but the judge, Judge Groom, delivered a long judgment. He said that he considered the law of sedition, &c., to be in force, but he found the traversers guilty of no crime.

Russia is making great military preparations, but is quiet, biding her time. England, as I said above is quiet; the total failure of the Chartism demonstration on the 10th, was a moral extinguisher. Ireland is in a most unsettled state; the country people are arming, and sedition language is loudly launched against the government. Dublin is occupied by a very considerable body of troops, and the government is determined to put down any attempt at rebellion. The leaders of the United Irishman party are indicted for seditious language.

A bill for the better security of the crown and government, has passed both Houses.

DENMARK & SCHLESWIG HOLSTEIN.

Affairs on the frontiers of Holstein and Schleswig continue much the same. The North German papers are full of the reports of the march of troops, so that there cannot be less than from 20,000 to 25,000 troops opposed to the Danes. The Duke of Brunswick has arrived at Rendsburg, where he was received with great joy; he will take the field against the Danes, at the head of his Brunswickers.

Reports of an armistice between the Danes and Prussians had prevailed; but it was said that there are only a few days allowed to the Danes to evacuate Schleswig, and that if they retreat, hostilities will be resumed.
