"Refolved, That there be granted to His MAJESTY for the fupport of the Government of this province the following duties of Impost, to wit: On every gallon of Rum, fix pence; on every gallon of Brandy, Geneva, and all other distilled

Spirituous Liquors, eight pence; on every gallon of Wine,

" nine pence; on every gallon of Molasses, two pence; on every hundred weight of Brown Sugar, two shillings; on all goods

"imported by Non-residents, two and a half per cent on the prime

" cost; on every pound of Bohea Tea, one penny; on every pound of Hyson, Souchong and all other Teas, two pence; on

every pound of Leaf Tobacco, one half penny; and on every

" pound of other Tobacco excepting that manufactured in Great

"Britain, two pence."

"And also on every pound of Loaf Sugar, one penny; on every hogshead of Porter, Ale, and Beer five shillings; and on every ry Pack of Playing Cards, fix pence—to be brought up in a se- parate bill with a suspending clause.

Reportaccepted.

Ordered, That the said report be accepted.

Bill brought in and read.

A bill " For the Establishment of Fees" being brought in by the committee appointed for that purpose—was read the first time.

Committee appinted. Ordered, That Mr. Robert Pagan, Mr. Fraser, and Captain McLean be a committee to bring in a bill. "For granting "the Supplies voted for the Services of the Year one thousand "feven hundred and ninety six."

House adjourn.

The House then adjourned until Monday morning at eleven o'clock.
