## An Act to provide for a permanent Civil List.

[27th March, 1871.

WHEREAS it is desirable that a permanent Civil List should be Preamble. established by Law;

Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of British Columbia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:

I. There shall be payable, in every year, to Her Majesty, Her Appropriation of Heirs and Successors, out of the General Revenue of this Colony, \$78,346 25 in every a sum not exceeding Seventy-eight thousand three hundred and year, for Civil List. forty-six Dollars and Twenty-five Cents, for defraying the expense of the several services and purposes named in the Schedule A. hereunto annexed.

II. The sums so set down in the said Schedule A., opposite to Sums in Schedule each Office or Department, shall be payable for each while the payable to present Incumbents at the time this Act comes into operation respectively lacumbents of office. remain in office.

III. The said sums shall be payable by the proper Officer of the Officer of the Trea-Treasury, upon the Warrant of the Governor or Officer Adminis- sury to pay on Governor's Warrant. tering the Government for the time being.

IV. This Act shall not come into operation until it has received Suspending Clause. Her Majesty's assent, and such assent has been proclaimed in the Colony.

V. This Act may be cited as "The Civil List Act, 1871."
