CANADA FAILS, BUT ENGLAND BEARS THE BURDEN

Premier Borden Refers to the Defeat of Naval Bill by the Senate. OTTAWA, June 10.—"As for the truth, accuracy and sincerity of the statements which were furnished to us from official sources, and upon which were based our proposals, I have only this to say that since our proposals failed in this Parliament, for reasons upon which I shall not dwell, it has been found necessary in the mother country to make certain provision by reason of our failure to bring that assistance which we had proposed to bring. According to my apprehension that is perhaps as good justification of the action which we proposed to take at the time as anyone in this House or in this country ought to desire."

Still of Same View. Still Sir Wilfrid thought it unwise to expostulate with the United States. Hon Mr. Lemieux made a long review of the naval debates of the past and declared that the premier was now reverting to the naval policy of Sir Wilfrid Laurier.

Premier Borden wanted to know whether Mr. Lemieux was opposed to the present proposals of the government or not. Mr. Lemieux—"I am against the Government."

Mr. Borden—"That's the explanation. The honorable gentleman is against the government no matter what the government does."
